Welcome to Table Talk with Pastor Hanson! Pull up a chair and let's talk about the Advent & Christmas Season in our Church!

The following is a tongue-in-cheek expose of the commercial excess that has so obscured the seasons of Advent and Christmas in our land. May it serve as a reminder to all of us that we need to work hard to keep Christ the focus of the season.

The True Meaning of Advent

Being that this is the first Sunday of Advent I thought it might be useful to give some information about this season. Advent is a shortened form of the the word Advertisement, of course you probably already knew that. This time of year, we get blasted by advertisements day and night to buy gifts and to attend sales. There are some groups that contend that Advertisement actually starts on Black Friday and that this is in fact the first day of the Celebration that merchandiser consider Good Friday. During the season of Advertisement we are supposed to be of good cheer for some amorphous reason that is never quite mentioned. Rumor has it that it all leads up to the event of some child born a while ago that takes place on Christmas Day. Who this child was is not important just that we should know that the season is all about family and buying stuff. During Advertisement people say Happy Holiday's to each other. The reason for this is that during this time Malls decorate with lots of Holly so people have considered this to be Holly days. There are also other joyful greetings like Season Greetings and 40 percent off. People spend time in thanks that they have not yet exceeded their credit limit, and they might forget that they have a Savior, but they will remember the savings. During the season of Advertisement the days are still 24 hours but are measured in shopping days instead. It is also a tradition for this season to be somewhat penitential. Penances such as having to park in overflow parking two miles away from the mall are common. After Christmas comes Advertisementide. This is the ad season of after Christmas sales and even more discounts. Later on, in the shopping season comes the season of Lent. This is because you have to get money lent to you to pay off your shopping bills.

There are also some customs associated with Advertisement such as the Advertisement Wreath. Each week you take all of your junk mail and roll it up and tighten it with a rubber band and place it in your Advertisement Wreath. The third week it is traditional to use advertisements from red tag sales. You can also make or order a Advertisement Calendar, though most calendars come with advertisements this is a special edition where you mark off shopping days so you know when to panic when you haven't got everything on your list. So, relax and have a happy Advertisement for whatever reason we are supposed to be *sellebrating*.

I suppose one could say that the giving and receiving of a gift is what's at the heart of Christmas and is what has led to the dreaded commercialization, but it doesn't have to take away our joy or the sense of gratitude that we have all received from our Creator, our heavenly Father.

This end of the year newsletter article is my public service announcement on how to combat the ever-present secularization of one our most cherished holidays. By now most of us have already begun thinking about all the things we need to do to get to Christmas day. There are the presents to buy, the decorations to get out, the Christmas cards to mail, the parties to attend and/or plan for, travel planning, and more! Just typing that last sentence has left me feeling overwhelmed...

I believe the season of Advent provides us with a remedy for the pressures and responsibilities that accompany Christmas. Each of the four Sundays in Advent have a theme to help remind us what Christmas is all about. We have **hope**, **peace**, **joy** and **love** to accompany us on the journey to Bethlehem. Focusing on these themes is, I believe, a great way to help us focus on what really matters. Attending worship during the busiest of months is a good starting point as we will focus on those four themes on their given Sundays. But, what about the other six days of the week?

I'm glad you asked! What if you spent a little time each day focusing on the theme of each week of Advent? Read some Scripture or a devotional related to **hope**, **peace**, **joy** or **love**? What if you spent a little time in prayer thanking God for the **hope**, **peace**, **joy** and **love** He provides? Perhaps even meditating or reflecting on how those four themes are present in your life every day during Advent. How might 28 days of intentional time impact your feelings about Christmas? You'll never know if you don't try.

Christmas is truly one of our greatest gifts and it is a holiday that should be filled with joy and the corny Christmas spirit. If it isn't or hasn't been that for you, that is what is truly lamentable. Are you feeling the weight and burden of all commercialization of this most sacred of holidays? It doesn't have to be that way my siblings in Christ. Join us for worship during the four Sundays of Advent (which includes Christmas Eve and/or Christmas Day) and be intentional in seeking, like the shepherds, that Babe in a manger during the season of Advent. We have already received the greatest gift ever, so you've got nothing to lose.



"There are so many things I wish I could share with my children, but whenever we are together, it seems we are always racing off to a soccer game or dance recital. We never really get to talk." This was the sentiment that Rachel was expressing to her sister as the two were enjoying an unseasonably warm November day on the screened porch. Rachel's husband passed away suddenly about two years ago and since then, these two sisters have spent more time together.

"I know what you mean," said Karen. "But that changed for me a few years ago when Bill and I put our estate plan together. We worked with an LCMS Foundation Gift Planning Counselor, and she kept insisting that we create a statement of faith to share with our family and friends. She called it a Family Blessing. The counselor also urged us to meet formally with our kids to share the details of our estate plan with them. It was then that Bill and I both read our Family Blessings to the kids out loud. By the end we were all shedding some tears and hugging. It was the first time in a long time that we had deep conversations about our confidence in Jesus, rather than just talking about attending Sunday service. It was great."

Rachel responded, "You know, since Fred died, I have been needing to review my estate plan. Maybe I'll give the counselor a call and see if she can help me do the same thing."


